2021 NATIONAL YOUTH TOBACCO SURVEY RESULTS



The National Youth Tobacco Survey collected responses from over 20,000 students in grades 6-12 from 279 schools. Data was collected between January 18-May 21, 2021. According to the CDC and the FDA, 11.3% of high school students (grades 9-12) and 2.8% of middle school students (grades 6-8)

used e-cigarettes in the past 30 days. Among users, 43.6% of high school students used on more than 20 of the last 30 days. 27.6% used every single day. The most commonly used e-cigs were flavored (fruit, candy, desserts, sweets, mint, and menthol). Since this data was collected during COVID-19, it's possible there was underreporting. Youth Mental Health A Major Priority

Mental health emergencies were increasing before the pandemic, but COVID-19 made it much worse. According to the White House, there was a 24% increase in emergency room visits for mental health reasons in children 5-11 years old. This was greater than 30% for children 12-17 years old. Luckily, Richland County has tons of resources. Check out this one pager from the Mental Health & Recovery Services Board.

Fentanyl Making Its Way Into Many Drugs Sold In The U.S.

Fentanyl is causing many problems for Americans. Fentanyl seizures have doubled from 1,112 pounds during the 1 year period of August 2019–July 2020 to 2,299 pounds during the 1 year period of August 2020–July 2021. You never know which drug may have been mixed with fentanyl. It's important to get pills with a trusted doctor's prescription rather than on the streets. Illegal street drugs are increasingly looking like prescription medications, but are sadly laced with other drugs like fentanyl, causing overdoses and deaths.

Prescription Drug Take Back Day on October 23rd was a huge success! Overall, 402.8 lbs of unused/expired medications were collected, nearly triple the amount from April 2021's Take Back Day. April 2021 totals are in parentheses ().
