The Cannabis Industry And The Term "Medical Cannabis"

This commentary from Dr. Bobby Smyth, a consultant child & adolescent psychiatrist, discusses the tactics the cannabis industry uses to soften attitudes towards its harm. The use of language is very important and the cannabis industry is intentional in what they're doing. This is a similar approach to the alcohol and tobacco industries.

Rocky Mountain HIDTA 2021 Marijuana Report

This annual report has a wealth of data tracking the impact of legalizing recreational marijuana in Colorado. <u>Some findings</u>: Suicide incidents with toxicology positive for marijuana has increased from 14% in 2013 to 29% in 2020. Most law enforcement contacts with students in 2019-2020 were for marijuana. Marijuana related exposures are steadily increasing, including children ages 0-12. Marijuana legalization has not reduced alcohol consumption. In fact, there has been a steady increase. There is a lot more to look at in the report, click the link above to check it out.

EMERGING DRUG TREND: WHAT IS DELTA-8?



Delta-8 has quickly gotten some nicknames including OTC weed, diet weed, and weed lite. It is nearly identical to delta-9, which is more commonly just referred to as marijuana. Delta-8 is currently being sold in many states, including Ohio,

often at gas stations. It is not approved by the FDA, has questionable marketing, and there are reported increases in adverse events due to its use.
