

<u>Buprenorphine Misinformation And Willingness To Treat Patients With Opioid</u> <u>Use Disorder Among Primary Care-Aligned Health Care Professionals</u>

Buprenorphine for opioid use disorder is highly effective, but often underused due to misinformation. This study surveyed 409 health care professionals in Ohio from September-December of 2022. The survey looked at various items of misinformation that the providers believed. The two most common items: Buprenorphine is ineffective at reducing overdose deaths and it simply substitutes one drug for another drug. Unfortunately, endorsing misinformation is not good for patients. It negatively predicted health care provider willingness to work with patients who have opioid use disorder. Strategies that specifically address misinformation about buprenorphine would be effective in treating and saving lives. Learn more <u>HERE</u>.

Ohio Legislature Overrides Tobacco Bill Veto

On Wednesday, January 24th, the Ohio Senate overturned Governor DeWine's veto of a bill that had banned local governments from prohibiting flavored tobacco sales. 90 days from this date, around April 24th, cities will no longer be able to stop retailers from selling flavored tobacco products.
